#### Hello from Mr West

Armistice Day, held on November 11<sup>th</sup> every year, commemorates the signing of the armistice between the Allies and Germany at 11am on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1918. Although hostilities continued in some areas, the armistice essentially brought an end to four years of fighting in the First World War.

On Thursday, as I am sure many of you did, the children and staff of Montpelier Primary School respected the tradition to pause for a two minute silence at 11am to remember those who gave their lives in the two world wars and those British servicemen and women killed or injured since 1945 - it was heartening to see so many families join us at this time.

The act of Remembrance rightly has a place in and impact on our lives, no matter which day of the week it might fall upon. The most important thing from our school perspective is that the memory of those who have given their lives and continue to serve our country to preserve the free world that we live in are remembered for many generations to come. ### Covid Reminders

The information below is a few COVID reminders from us at Montpelier:

If your child has symptoms of COVID-19 (a continuous cough, a high temperature or loss of taste/smell), they must have a PCR test and NOT a LFT test. An LFT test is designed to identify cases of COVID in asymptomatic cases.


When reporting an absence and leaving a message, please state the reason for absence. For example, sickness, cold, chickenpox etc.

Please note that if you report one of the main COVID-19 symptoms on a message, our Admin Team will call back and ask that you get your child a PCR test.
